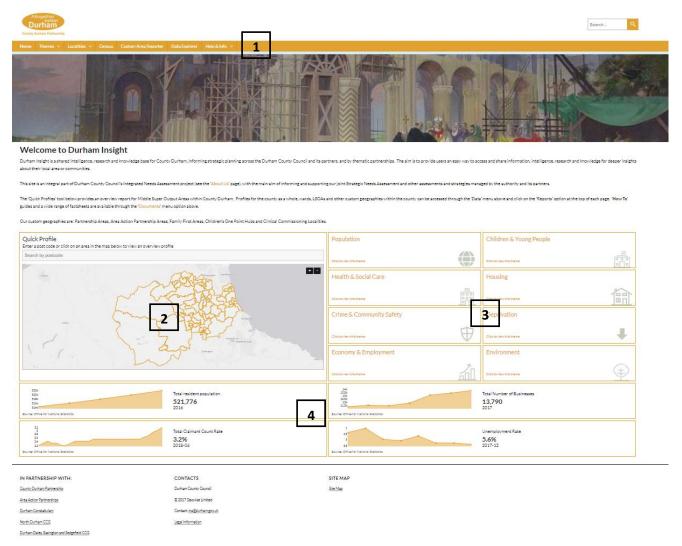
# **Durham Insight**

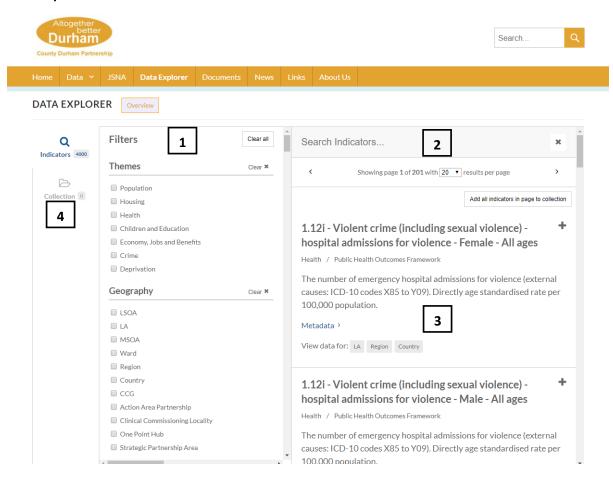

# Menu Bar

- Home: This takes you back to the 'Home' page,
- Themes: This gives access to the indicators used on the site which are organized into 'Themes',
  - JSNA: This section now sits under the 'Heath & Wellbeing' theme and details the county's Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA),
- Localities: This gives access to a range of geographical profiles for areas within County Durham. Currently profiles are available for County Durham, Area Action Partnerships (AAPs) and Middle Super Output Areas (MSOAs),

- Census: Information on the 2011 Census and forthcoming 2021 Census,
- Custom Area Reporter: Select your own sub-county areas and generate a report based on your selections,
- **Data Explorer:** Use this to build your own indicator list, map them and view them in a table. The 'Data Explorer' view, is covered in a separate guide'
- Help & Info: Groups together:
  - Documents: Useful documents derived from the indicators and used in tour Integrated Needs Assessment (INA) project,
  - o News: Information on new developments and data releases'
  - Links: Useful links to data sources and other analysis,
  - o **About Us:** Brief explanation of the site, the INA process and Geowise.

### **Data Explorer Dash Board**



- 1. Filter: Use this section to narrow your search of the 4000+ indicators available,
- 2. Search: Using key words,
- 3. Indicator List,
- **4. Collection:** This will indicate how many indicators you have selected and is used to access these selected indicators.

#### **Filtering**

The 'Filter; section allows you to narrow down the list of available indicators by selecting the check boxes under each section. The sections are:

- Theme
- Geography
- Publisher
- Source

As you select options in this section the list of indicators in area 3 above is automatically updated.

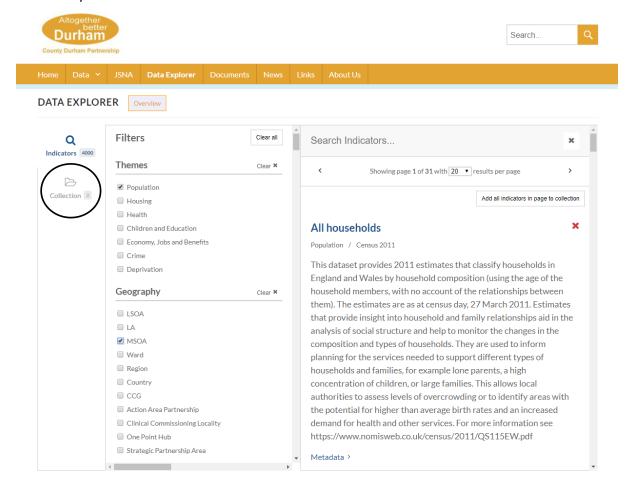
#### Search

You can search for indicators using key words, for example 'Population', to narrow down the list of indictors displayed in area 3 above. You can also use the filter options (area 1) in conjunction with a key word search.

## **Selecting indicators**

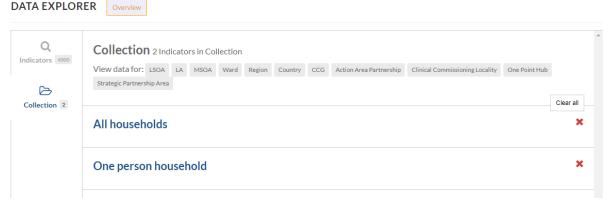
When you have narrowed down your choices using the filter and search options you can then scroll through the list of available indicators shown in area 3 above. Click the '+' sign next to each indictor to add it to your 'collection'. To remove an indicator click the 'X' sign that replaces the '+' sign next to the indicator.

To view your selections click the 'Collection' link in area 4 above, which also shows how many indicators you have selected as shown below.



#### Collection

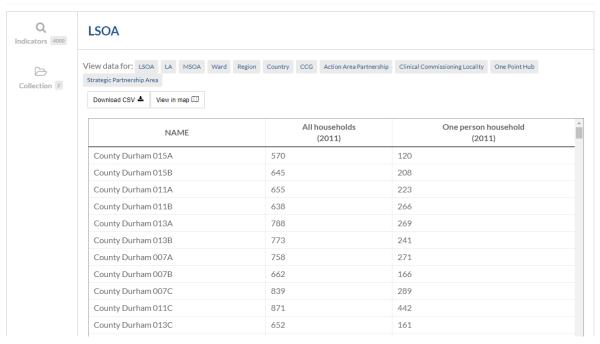
Clicking the 'Collection' link on the left then displays a list of the indicators you have chosen:



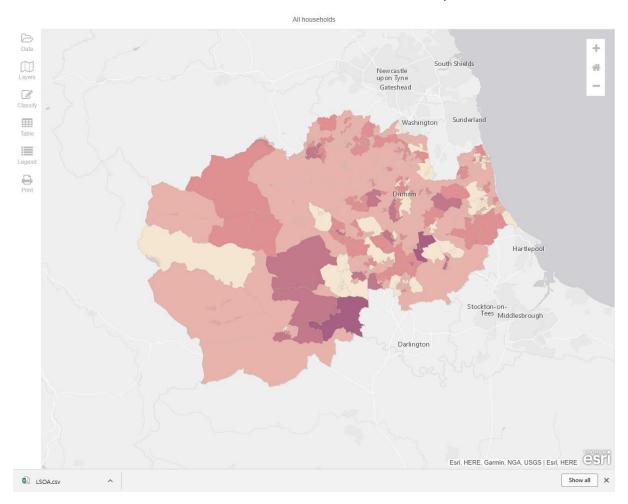
Here you can deselect indicators or choose the geographical level at which to display/work at.
